First, by "girls" in the title, Girls and Women in Classical Greek Religion, Dillon almost exclusively means "young women," that is, fully adolescent females -- nubile from an ancient Greek perspective. Only on rare occasion does he refer to prepubescent girls in Greek religion (e.g., 57, ).
